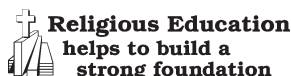

THE MASS – LITURGICAL COLORS

Throughout the year, the colors of the Priests outermost vestment is a different color depending upon the liturgical season or feast. Each color has a symbolic meaning. The vestment is called the **“CHASUBLE”**. It is like a poncho and symbolizes the Priest “Putting on Christ”.

The color **GREEN** is used throughout much of the year. It is worn in the Liturgical Season of ORDINARY TIME, the time between PENTECOST AND ADVENT. ITS SYMBOL IS HOPE AND LIFE.

The color WHITE is worn at the **CHRISTMAS AND EASTER SEASONS** and at any feast days that are dedicated to the Blessed Mother, non-martyr saints and at funerals. ITS SYMBOL IS PURITY, HOLINESS, INNOCENCE AND JOY.

The color **RED** is worn on **PALM SUNDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY, PENTECOST** and on feast days of martyrs who shed their blood for the faith. ITS SYMBOL IS LOVE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT, AND BLOOD OF MARTYRS.

The color **VIOLET/PURPLE** is worn during **LENT AND ADVENT**. ITS SYMBOL IS PENANCE, HUMILITY AND EXPECTATION.

The color **ROSE** is worn on the third Sunday in ADVENT and the fourth Sunday in LENT. ITS SYMBOL IS JOY OF ANTICIPATION OF CHRISTMAS AND EASTER.

The color **GOLD** is worn on the feast days of major solemnities. ITS SYMBOL IS MAJESTY AND CEREMONIAL.

As the Priest puts on the CHASUBLE, he prays this prayer: “O LORD, WHO HAS SAID, MY YOKE IS EASY AND MY BURDEN LIGHT: GRANT THAT I MAY BE ABLE SO TO BEAR IT THAT I MAY OBTAIN THY GRACE. AMEN!
